

**TURK LAKE
LAKE IMPROVEMENT BOARD
HEARING OF PRACTICABILITY & REVIEW OF APPORTIONMENTS
August 16, 2022**

A special meeting of the Turk Lake, Lake Improvement Board was held in the Montcalm Township Hall, 1880 S Greenville Rd., Greenville, Michigan on the 16th day of August 2022 at 6:00 p.m.

The hearing of practicability was called to order by Katy Bradley at 6:00 p.m.

Chairman Bradley introduces the lake board members and Jennifer and Mike from Restorative Lake Sciences.

A motion was made by Todd S and seconded by Tom to accept the minutes of the August 4, 2022; meeting as presented. Motion carried.

Todd S explained the procedures of the Hearing of Practicability and the Review of Apportionments and the necessity of both hearings.

Presentation

Mike and Jennifer provided some background on their history with the lake, highlighting that they have been consulting on the lake since 2006. Jennifer explained what RLS does for the lake. She went over what the Lake Improvement Board does. Mike explained the RLS manages the lake but does not apply the chemicals. Jennifer provided pictures of the lake highlighting the problem areas and plants. She provided an example of an early season lake scan. Jennifer presented water quality data to the board. She explained the types of algae that can be found in the lake and also explained the different types of native plants that they cannot treat and the ecosystems that they do not want to disrupt. The major problem plant on the lake is Eurasian Milfoil. She provided the different treatment options that were available to treat the Milfoil. She explained the different types of chemicals that can be used to treat the Milfoil in terms of effectiveness and cost. Jennifer went through the cost breakdown and proposed budget. She provided her future recommendations for the lake and advised what could happen to the lake with no treatments. Jennifer told the residents that they should be contacting RLS and the lake board members when they see issues with the lake. Mike advised that Kate should be notified of issues on the front lake and Todd M should be notified of issues on the back lake. Mike stated that the lake is surveyed 3-5 times per year.

Fish Stocking

Todd S mentioned fish stocking and told the board that we can use surplus lake funds for fish stocking and also add it as a line item in the budget at the hearing. Todd advised that board of what types of fish are currently

available and what would do well in the lake. He also provided pricing information. Todd believes they should look into stocking both predator and prey into the lake. The board would like to add fish stocking to the budget in the amount of \$2,500.00 per year. The Aquatic Herbicide Treatments/Mechanical Harvesting line will be reduced to \$21,500.00 from \$24,000.00 to allow for the fish stocking.

A motion was made by Todd S and seconded by Tom to add a line item to the budget in the amount \$2,500.00 for fish stocking. Motion carried.

The chairman opened the meeting up to the public for questions and comments.

Kristy Kwiatowski asked what type of information should be passed on to the lake board members. Jennifer said they should report anything that is out of the norm. They should be reporting any issues they find.

Marilyn Perkins asked for the contact information for the Lake Board Members. Anne advised that the contact information for all lake board members is available on the County website.

Cindy Ellis asked about the effects of a sewer system on the lake. Jennifer said there is no way to definitively that septic nutrients are entering the lake. Jennifer believes that properly maintained septic systems are key to lake quality.

Cindy Ellis asked about how to test for extra nutrients coming from septic systems. Jennifer said that they can test each property individually for extra nutrients at the cost of the residents.

Cindy Ellis asked about fish stocking. Todd S advised that that topic is scheduled for later in the meeting.

Bob Dood asked why there was a conductivity spike in the lake in the spring. Jennifer stated that this was due to the salt that was washing off the road and into the lake.

Dave Homich asked what distance from the shore they are allowed to treat. Mike advised that it was 0-100 feet from shore for nuisance natives.

Dave Homich asked how late in the year they are allowed to treat. Jennifer said that there is no time limit on treatments in the permit as the lakes freeze over winter, but treatments are not done into late September, weather dependent.

Dave Homich asked if treatments done later in the season have a noticeable effect on the spring growth. Jennifer said that Milfoil will always grow and can take off really fast regardless of how late treatments are done.

Cindy asked about long term effects of short-term wells. Jennifer stated that they allow chemicals for immediate use, but long-term effects won't be known immediately. She added that the half life of ProcellaCore is 1-6 days.

Brad VanderMoere asked how many treatments have been completed on the lake so far this year. Mike said that they have completed two treatments so far this year. One smaller one in May and a larger one in June. Jennifer added that any funds not spent on weed treatments are held as a surplus in the board finances and can be used in the future. She advised to hold on to 1.5-2 years of assessment as contingency funds.

Brad VanderMoere stated that he believes the surplus being held is too high and the assessment should not be raised.

Marilyn Knapp asked about the classification of the lake. Jennifer responded that the lake is classified as a private lake because there is no public launch or DNR funded launch.

Greg Kwiatowski asked what fish stocking will do to the ecosystem of the lake. Jennifer said that it depends on the lake eco system and needs. She suggested stocking the lake with smaller predator fish.

There being no further questions or comments from the public, the Hearing of Practicability was closed by a motion from Todd S and seconded by Kate. Motion Carried.

The Resolution to Proceed with Improvements was offered for approval to the Lake Board.

The Special Assessment District for Turk Lake includes all properties which border the lake and back lots which have deeded or dedicated lake access. Special assessments for the project are proposed to be apportioned in the following manner:

Use Factors

• Lakefront/300 foot of frontage or less	1	\$173.03
• Lakefront/over 300 foot of frontage	2	\$346.06
• Lakefront lots with one structure occupied by two or more rental units	.75 per unit	\$129.77
• Second Tier lots with deeded /dedicated access	.75	\$129.77
• Third Tier lots with deeded/dedicated access	.5	\$86.51
• Back lots with one structure occupied by two or more rental units	.5 per unit	\$86.51
• Lots that are unbuildable because of lot size or zoning restrictions	.5	\$86.51

Note: Contiguous lots in common ownership are proposed to be assessed as a single parcel provided only one dwelling exists on the parcel. Single parcels with more than one dwelling will be assessed per dwelling.

The hearing for the review of apportionments was called to order by Chairman Bradley at 7:05 p.m.

Presentation of Special Assessment Roll

Todd S presented the tax roll and explained the benefit factor used to determine the amount to assess each parcel.

Chairman Bradley opened the hearing up for questions and comments from the public.

Dick Palmer said that 5 years ago they discussed the factor 2 for over 300 ft of lake frontage being charged as a factor of 1.5. Todd provided the previous budget and advised that the factor for over 300 feet of lake frontage has been listed as a factor of 2 in the previous budgets.

Dick asked why the apportionment goes up so much from a factor 1 to a factor 2 when the only difference is lake frontage. He does not believe his lake usage goes up by having more lakefront property. Todd stated that it was the previous administration that set up the benefit factors and he does not know what their reasoning was. The board reviewed the roll and saw that Dick was already only being assessed at a factor of 1.5. Todd advised that this board has extensive factors that can make assessing more difficult.

Marilyn Perkins asked about her access to the lake as one neighbor has put up a fence blocking her access. Todd advised that was a civil matter and could not be resolved by the lake board.

Brad VanderMoere said that the value of the assessment is assessed on the value of the property. He also asked why the assessment is being raised when there is such a large surplus and stated that he is against the increase. Mike stated that they are looking at a significant increase in chemical prices currently and there is no way of knowing how much more they will increase over the next five years and this budget allows the board a cushion.

Brad stated that he would like to stick with the current budget and not go forward with the proposed increase. Todd said they could stay with the current budget, but if they run out of money there is no borrowing mechanism for the Lake Improvement Boards.

Kristy Kwiatowski was if the assessment can be lowered in later years if the surplus gets too high. Todd said that it is a common practice to spread a lower amount in years 4 and 5 of the program if the surplus is too large.

Many residents stated that they would prefer the larger budget to allow for a cushion in the funds.

There being no further questions or comments from the public on the Review of Apportionments, the hearing was closed by Todd S and seconded by Tom. Motion carried.

The Resolution Confirming the Special Assessment Roll was offered for approval by the Lake Board.

The assessments made in said Special Assessment Roll are hereby ordered and directed to be collected, and the Clerk of Montcalm Township shall deliver said Special Assessment Roll to the Township Treasurer, with his/her warrant attached, commanding the treasurer to collect the assessments therein in accordance with the directions of the Lake Board, and the treasurer is directed to collect the amounts assessed as the same become due.
